

The Colonial Coin Collectors Club's Young Numismatist Scholarship Program for ANA Summer Seminar 2025

The American Numismatic Association's (ANA) Summer Seminar is the best educational experience in numismatics. Students can learn to grade coins, detect counterfeits, and acquire knowledge of modern printing. Whether your interest is American colonial coins, U.S. Mint products, world coins, ancients, medals, tokens, or paper money, a class or mini-seminar is available for youth and adults eager to expand their numismatic knowledge.

The class experience is a true seminar. The classes are small, and everyone participates. Students learn from their instructors, recognized leaders in their field, and their fellow students' collective experiences. The Summer Seminar consists of two six-day segments between late June and early July each year.

Summer Seminar can be a life-changing event. Past attendees have launched careers as successful numismatic collectors, authors, and dealers. The Colonial Coin Collectors Club (C4) is offering a monetary scholarship for a YN (Young Numismatist) collector to attend the 2025 ANA Summer Seminar, held on the campus of The Colorado College in beautiful Colorado Springs, Colorado.

This is an opportunity for numismatic scholarship and camaraderie, offering students a wide and varied selection of week-long courses suited for anyone from the curious beginner to the most advanced numismatist. YNs, ages 13 to 17, stay in a Colorado College dormitory with a group of experienced chaperons and mentors. Along with attending classes, YNs participate in a variety of special activities and events designed for them. If there are no qualified younger applicants, C4 may consider awarding the YN scholarship to a young collector in the 18-22 age range.

The scholarship will be between \$500 and \$1,000, depending on the candidate's needs and the strength of the application. The scholarship is open to non-members of C4, but C4 members have priority. Candidates may join C4 at the time they submit their application. The award recipient must agree to take at least one class on colonial numismatics and write a 2-page paper on the experience to be published in the *C4 Newsletter*. All candidates must complete the attached application form.
